






To build a clean and safe home Let's take action!



### According to the report from US CDC:

Every day, over 300 children in the United States ages 0 to 19 are treated in an emergency department, and two children die, as a result of being poisoned. It's not just chemicals in your home marked with clear warning labels that can be dangerous to children. Everyday items in your home, such as household cleaners and medicines, can be poisonous to children as well. (1)

### According to US Poison Control Center data:

The leading causes of non-medication exposure calls to poison control centers for children ages 5 and under were cosmetics and personal care products, household cleaning substances, foreign bodies/toys, pesticides and plants<sup>(2)</sup>. These products can cause chemical burns, blindness, even death. <sup>(3)</sup>





### General situation of children poisoning in China:

Poisoning is one of the main causes of injury and death among children aged 0-4  $\,^{(1)}$ 

Over 1,500 children aged 0-14, on average, die from poisoning each year in China. (1)

Children, have you seen these bottles and pots at home? Do you know what are they used for? Do not touch these products! Never put them into your month to eat!













# • Understand labels, and properly use products

Have you read the labels on the packages of household cleaning products?

The label information is important! The following are some tips for properly using household cleaning products.

DO – You must do these!	
Always:	Always read and follow the usage instruction and warning statement, correctly use, store and dispose products, know product labels well, understand the safety information on labels, and pay particular attention to all home safety warnings, such as the statements on "warning", "danger" or "do not touch children", and what you should do in the case of an injury.
Away:	Store cleaning products in a place away from food, and do not allow children to use them.
Store:	After taking all cleaning products back home, immediately store them in a high position in the cabinet, and keep them out of sight of children and beyond reach of children.
Keep:	Keep products in the originally packaged container with a complete label, and ensure that such products are intact.
Close:	After using products every time, completely close the container, and put the container out of reach of children right away.
Discard:	If a product container is empty, correctly discard it. Do not reuse it for other purposes, including holding articles and toys of children.
Clean up:	Immediately clean up any overflowing cleaning products. Wash your hands and any articles that you use to dump or measure the products.
Attention:	Pay special attention to spraying agents. They are common sources of accidental poisoning. They should be placed beyond reach of children.

#### DON'T – You cannot do these


Do not mix cleaning products. If a safe product in a separate use is mixed with other products, it may sometimes emit irritant or hazardous smoke.

Do not reuse an empty container of household cleaning products, and hold other cleaning products with such container. The label description and points for attention of the original products are incorrect and invalid for newly held products.

Do not allow children to take cleaning products, because they are not toys.

Do not store cleaning products at the tops of the washing machine and the drier, or on the ground by the washing machine.






# Self-check list

Self-check list of safe use of household cleaning products

I place cleaning products in my home in a high position beyond reach of children or lock them in a cabinet. I never put them on the ground or at a corner.
Before using the cleaning product, I read the labels carefully and understand the first aid measure in case of accidental exposure.
After finishing using cleaning products, I immediately put them back, keeping them away from children.
After running out of cleaning products, I immediately discard their pots, and do not hold children's articles with them.
I keep all cleaning products in their original containers, and this point is clearly indicated on the containers.
I put the lids on the used closestool, washing machine and drier. After clothes are washed, I will empty water inside the washing machine.
As the washing machine works, I will stop children from touching the machine.
After finishing using an electrical product, I will pull out its plug, and shut down its power supply.
When I leave, I will close the door of the laundry. Thus, curious children will not enter the laundry.

# • First aid measures

In case of children accidental exposure to the cleaning product, please wash it off with water. If the product gets into the eyes, wash it off immediately with plenty of water and seek medical advice. If accidently eat product, give water/milk and doctor immediately. Do not induce vomiting. If any serious case, please call 120 immediately.
